Off-Center Errors

Here are records of recent sales of off-center mint errors on eBay:

1. All coins were listed on eBay and closed from April 1, 2006 to June 30, 2006.
2. All lots had buyers. If the coins actually changed hands is unknown.
3. A picture accompanied each lot or it was not recognized.
4. Mislabeled items were ignored.
5. Some lots may have changed hands more than once.

6. "D" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage or was scratched.

7. "C" next to the date symbolizes that the coin was cleaned.

8. "B" next to the date symbolizes that the coin had damage and was cleaned.

9. If the date or mint mark was missing or partially visible, parentheses were used.

10. Postage/handling/insurance fees were ignored.

11. Major auctions were not listed.

PCGS Certifies 1806 \$5 Capped Bust Triple Struck Mint Error



John Dannreuther is one of the founders and owners of PCGS. He is a well known professional numismatist, scholar, researcher, world class grader and has authored and co-authored many research books on coins. This 1806 \$5 Capped Bust to Right, Heraldic Eagle, Pointed 6, 8X5 Stars Gold Piece was actually struck four times. John Dannreuther's research and scans clearly illustrate the four strikes as this coin was struck off-center, rotated and then centered. With only six to ten pieces known of this rare die variety and considering that it is also struck four times, this discovery coin is a significant numismatic rarity. The following are his comments on the research he conducted regarding this discovery coin.

This is one of the rarest early gold varieties with an estimate of 6 to 10 known in my new book on early gold (covering the 205 known varieties of the three denominations from 1795 to the 1834 Motto coinage). This example is the earliest die state encountered and this fabulous error coin may explain the rarity of this early half eagle variety (Bass-Dannreuther 3, Miller 80, Breen unlisted). Both dies failed early with this variety, this unique obverse and reverse die pair's only use. This is unusual in the early half eagle series, as dies were used until they failed, sometimes paired with multiple dies to create several varieties. The BD-3 variety quickly developed the die crack that traverses from the edge through the top of the cap, meanders down through the head, and ends at the edge below the right side of the 0 of the date. On this error example only part of this eventually bisecting crack has developed, while neither the field break behind the head nor the crack from Star 6 through 8 to the rim have appeared. Thus, there seems to be a good explanation for the absence of these cracks on this coin.

It appears that this coin may have caused the cracks by stressing the dies! This coin first was struck in normal alignment about 10-15% off center. After this first strike it was rotated about 90 degrees and struck properly centered between the dies. It then appears to have been slightly rotated again and struck a third time. The fourth and final blow was in proper alignment, as well as centered, and results in an almost normal looking coin - at least at first glance.

Closer examination reveals the date at 9:00 on the obverse (second, and possibly a third, strike)



FOUR sets of stars (second, third, and fourth)

The first strike was off center so only a few left stars, but quite a few denticils



A mangle of lettering under UNITED on the reverse (second and third strikes)



The obverse die was in the lower position for this variety (this changed with the introduction of the 1806 Knobbed 6 half eagle later that year), so I believe the obverse and reverse dies of this coin were damaged with this striking, especially the obverse, which took a more severe blow. As noted, all examples of this very rare 1806 Pointed 6 (BD-3) variety seen until this point had the field break left of the head and the crack from S6-S8, so this coin is the likely culprit: Sherlock Holmes would arrest this coin!

It is the coin that “cracked” the dies. To find such an unusual coin of such a rare die variety is unusual, indeed!

Here is the excerpt from John Dannreuther's new book on this rare variety:

Die States: State a, no clashing, no lapping, no cracks either side.

● State b, now with faint vertical crack on cap, another S-5 - S-8, another S9 - S13; reverse same.

● State c, another crack, S1 - S3; reverse same.

● State d, terminal, now with heavy crack edge - cap - hair - through o - edge, another edge - field between S6 & S7, connecting to crack or clashing behind head, although cracks seem to run along the clashing; reverse with some unknown injury, as this is first and only use.

Bass notebook: "OBV: Pointed 6. Close date, 1806, with top of 1 imbedded in curl. Tip of 6 overlies drapery. 0 leans to left! Large letters LIBERTY, T without bottom left serif. REV: Large letters, except for A's in AMERICA." For HBCC-3097, Mr. Bass noted: "Vertical crack in hat. REV: Large D and A." The comments for HBCC-3102 also were short: "Obverse crack; 2nd known specimen."

The core collection retained all three varieties of this very rare variety, each in different states of the dies. As Mr. Bass noted, this is the only 1806 obverse die that used the T without its left foot. Thus, undoubtedly this was the last obverse die created before the letter punch set was replaced with the slightly smaller size one used for the Knobbed 6 variety (BD-6). It is uncertain where this variety belongs in the emission sequence, but it has been placed here in deference to Edgar Adams who listed it as his variety 2. This coin may belong elsewhere, possibly even after BD-6, the available Knobbed 6 variety.

Miller thought this variety was unique, but Harry Bass owned three examples! There are likely only a few other examples of this super rarity out there, as Breen did not even list this variety in his monograph on half eagles! However, Adams and Newcomer both recorded this very rare die variety. Adams noted: "Die crack through '0'; Leaf of olive branch and bases of 'R' and 'I' united." One can see that no other 1806 variety fits these criteria, save this one.

Harry Bass rediscovered this variety in 1970 when he bought the Gaston DiBello coin in the Stack's sale of that collection. This coin earlier appeared in S.H. Chapman's Wilson sale in 1907, likely the example noted by Adams and possibly the Newcomer specimen.

Another example appeared in the Bowers and Merena 12/2003 auction as Lot 2548, although no variety was noted in the catalog.

Since this was the only use of the obverse and reverse, we can surmise that the reverse suffered some injury like the obverse displays on HBCC-3102.



NGC Certifies Double Struck 1873 \$20 J-1344

This is an extremely rare pattern which is also double struck. There are only two certified including this piece. It is a die trial of the regular design for the 1873 Closed 3 \$20 gold piece that was struck in copper. It was double struck in the collar with rotation between the two strikes. Considerable detail from the original strike is visible on the obverse, on the stars, date and portrait. The reverse also shows considerable detail remaining from the first strike as well on UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, TWENTY D. and the eagle. The close-up photos below show the rotation on this double struck \$20 pattern.

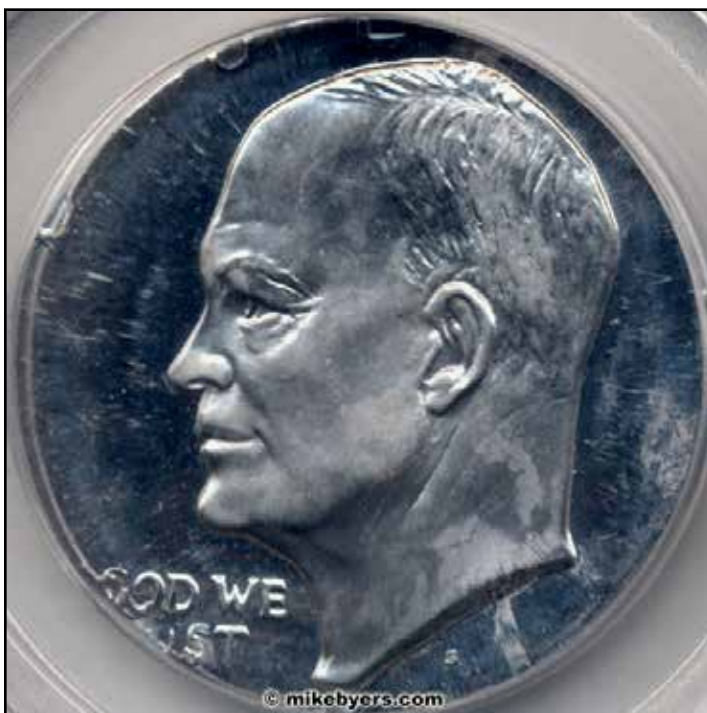

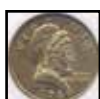

1973-S Kennedy Half Dollar Struck on Struck Aluminum Token

A very small group of PROOF errors recently came from a collection that was auctioned by the State of California. The U.S. Secret Service inspected and released this collection to the State of California determining that it was legal to own. The State of California then auctioned the collection and it has been dispersed since the sale. This Proof Mint Error came from this collection.

Proof Kennedy Half Dollar mint errors are very rare with only a few known. This is one of the ultimate Kennedy Half Dollar major mint errors being offered in today's market. It would be the centerpiece of any Kennedy Half Dollar or mint error collection.

This price guide is brought to you by Mint Error News. It has been compiled by many of the top major mint error dealers.

This price guide is a guide. Prices fluctuate due to the date, grade, eye appeal and how dramatic the striking error is. Rarity is also a factor. The price is sometimes based on the rarity and grade of the type of coin as well as how rare the error is. The price can also vary depending on whether two collectors are bidding for the same rare major mint error. When purchasing a mint error, it is important to use multiple resources to determine value, as there are many mint errors that do not fit into one category.

Proof Errors



Proof coins are struck by technicians who hand feed the blanks into special presses. They are produced, examined, and packaged using extreme quality control. It is very unusual to find major proof errors. A few broadstrikes, off-centers, double strikes in collars and off-metals have been known to be found in sealed proof sets. Proof errors are aggressively sought after by many error collectors.

A very small group of Proof errors recently came from a collection that was auctioned by the State of California. The U.S. Secret Service inspected and released this collection to the State of California determining that it was legal to own. The State of California then auctioned the collection and it has been dispersed since the sale.

Broadstrikes



A broadstruck error occurs when a coin is struck without the collar to form the rim and edge that is part of the shape of the coin. Coins can be broadstruck on either type one or type two planchets. When a coin is broadstruck the blank being fed into the collar will spread and distort outward as it is being struck because the collar isn't in the correct position to retain it.

Partial Collars



Partial collar strikes occur when there is a malfunction of the striking press. This causes the collar to be in an incorrect position. The lower die (usually the reverse die) is recessed in the collar. This allows the coin which is going to be struck to have a formed rim. After a coin is struck the lower die raises upwards, pushing the struck coin out of the collar and ejecting it. If a blank entering the collar is not properly seated, it will only have partial reeding as it is struck. The edge of this coin will have a partial reeding and a partial blank surface area. Recently, the Mint has installed new machinery where either die can be installed in either position.

Uniface Strikes



Uniface coins occur when there have been two blank planchets in the press at the same time. The other blank will obstruct the die on either the obverse or reverse side, which will prevent it from having that design on the coin. There are many different variations involving uniface errors. In addition to having a 100% blank obverse or reverse, a coin can be struck off-center, with a blank planchet in the collar which will obstruct one side of the off-center. There are also mated pairs which have a combination of multiple errors which can include a side which is uniface. Finally, there are uniface strikes due to a die cap which adhered to the die, forming itself in the shape of a die and striking blank planchets.

Bonded Coins



Bonded coins occur when the feeder system, which supplies blank planchets to the coin press, malfunctions and jams. When this occurs, a struck coin is not properly ejected and another planchet is fed into the collar and is struck. This struck coin will land on top of the previously unejected strike. These coins will then crush and bond together. This may occur many times as more coins bond.

Coins Struck on Feeder Finger Tips



After a recent tour of the U.S. Mint at Philadelphia, it was discovered that the minting process had changed to some degree. One of the changes was that “feeder fingers” were used during the striking of all denominations of U.S. coins. Prior to this tour, U.S. coins that were struck on feeder finger tips were authenticated and described as being struck on aluminum scrap. Coins from all modern denominations have been discovered that were struck on the tips of these feeder fingers.

Struck Fragments



The blanking press takes the coils of metal strips and punches blanks out of it, ejecting the webbing at the other end. The webbing is cut into small scrap pieces to be melted and recycled. Occasionally a scrap piece will be mixed with the blank planchets and struck by the dies. Struck fragments are rare in the larger denominations. These can be uniface or die struck both sides and are very rare on type coins.

Mated Pairs



Mated pairs involve two individual coins with different errors that were struck together at the same time. Mated pair error combinations can be found in most error types and come in many shapes and sizes. Mated pairs can be overlapped when one of the coins is struck off-center on top of another coin. Another type involves a brockage where a struck coin was perfectly centered on a blank and restruck. Some mated pairs involve a die cap where the cap and brockage coin are discovered together, but this is a scarce find.

The rarest mated pair type involves two die caps (obverse and reverse) where both dies were capped at the same time and both die caps are mated. This last type is extremely rare and there are only a few known examples of mated pairs involving an

obverse die cap and reverse die cap. There are several of these mated pairs known on Kennedy Halves including two dated 1976, which is the Bicentennial year. One of the most spectacular mated pairs involve two Barber Dimes, an obverse die cap mated to a reverse die cap and are unique.

Mated pairs can also involve an off-metal where a smaller blank planchet or smaller struck coin was struck on top of a larger coin. This type is extremely rare. The most spectacular pair known is a double struck Franklin Half which was mated to a Lincoln Cent. The Lincoln Cent blank was on top of the obverse of the struck Franklin Half. This pair was then struck together. It is unique.

Transitional Errors



A transitional error occurs when a coin is struck on a planchet from a previous year with different metal composition. The most famous transitional is a 1943 copper cent struck on a 1942 copper blank. 1943 cents were struck in steel because of the copper shortage during World War II. Other famous transitionals include 1965 coinage struck in silver instead of clad.

There are also transitionals struck on blanks for the next year. An example is 1964 coinage in clad instead of silver. Most recently, transitionals were discovered involving the SBA and Sacagawea Dollars of 1999 and 2000. There are eight known 1999 SBA Dollars struck on the brass planchet for the 2000 Sacagawea Dollar, and four known 2000 Sacagawea Dollars struck on a clad planchet for the 1999 SBA Dollar.

U.S. Gold Errors



Major mint errors on U.S. Gold coins are the most prized category of all mint errors. Gold errors are very rare and a few have traded in the \$75,000 to \$100,000 range. Even a broadstruck U.S. Gold coin can easily sell for \$15,000 to \$30,000 compared to a broadstruck Cent, Nickel, Dime or Quarter which all sell for well under \$10. Many serious collectors of Gold Errors have to wait patiently for months and sometimes even years to acquire that one special piece for their collection.

The prices listed here are for common dates in AU-Unc. Better dates and errors that are in gem condition are worth considerably more.

Indents



An indent error occurs when two blanks are fed inadvertently into the same collar, with one blank partly overlaying on top of the other. When the hammer die strikes this combination, the upper blank will be forced into the lower blank, creating a depression which is shaped similar to the upper blank. A scarce type of indent occurs when a blank intended for one denomination lands on top of a blank from a different denomination.

Capped Dies



A capped die is caused when a struck coin sticks to the upper hammer die. Once the coin is struck to the die face, the reverse of the struck coin becomes the new die face. When the next blank is fed into the collar and the strike occurs, the reverse design of the adhered struck coin impresses itself into the new blank. This struck coin is a brockage strike. The coin that adhered to the upper die is known as a die cap. This process repeats itself as more coins are struck by the cap. The greater the number of strikes, the higher the cap metal will be pushed around the upper die shaft. Eventually, the cap brakes away from the die in the shape of a thimble.

Die Adjustment Strikes



Die adjustment strikes are also known as die trials. This error occurs when a coin is struck from the press with very little pressure. When the press is being set up and adjusted, extremely weak strikes occur as the strike pressure reaches its optimum level. These die trials are destroyed after being struck and are rarely found in circulation.

Double Denominations



One of the most expensive, popular, and desired types of errors are the double denominations. This error happens when a coin is struck on a previously struck coin of a smaller denomination. Examples are a cent on a struck dime, and a nickel on a struck cent. The most dramatic are those with considerable design visible from the original strike. There are a few known double denominations with different dates.

Brockages



A brockage error can only occur when there are two coins involved. One of the coins involved will always be a struck coin which has not ejected properly. That struck coin will find its way back between the dies and will be struck next to a blank planchet which was fed into the collar. The image of that first struck coin will be impressed into that side of the blank planchet. The result will be a second coin which has images of the first coin impressed into it. Those images will be pressed into the coin and the image will be in reverse. This incuse sunken image is known as a brockage.

Double & Multiple Strikes



When a blank planchet is struck by the dies, the normal procedure is for the feeders to eject the struck coin out of the collar and into a chute. If there is a malfunction and the struck coin isn't ejected, it may receive a second or third strike by the dies. A multiple struck coin can happen in many ways and have many combinations of errors.

Off-Center Strikes



Off-center coins are one of the most common and best known types of errors. This happens when a blank which is supposed to be fed into the press, lands in the collar improperly. When this occurs only part of the blank is between the upper and lower dies. When the dies strike the blank, only that part will be struck with a design.

Off-Metals



Off-metal and wrong planchet errors occur when a correctly made blank from one denomination is accidentally fed into a press for another denomination. Examples are a nickel struck on a cent planchet and a cent struck on a dime planchet. The coin struck on an incorrect blank will weigh exactly what the denomination of that blank would have been. An even more dramatic wrong planchet error is a coin struck on a previously struck coin of a different metal.

Cent/Dime Mule Sold For \$138,000 in Heritage Auction at Central States

Editor's Note: This Cent/Dime Mule sold for \$138,000 in the Heritage Galleries Auction at the Central States coin show. Here is the description from the auction listing:

1999 1C Lincoln Cent Obverse Die Muled With a Roosevelt Dime Reverse on a Lincoln Cent Planchet MS66 Red PCGS. This incredible error somehow escaped the scrutiny of Mint employees. We are uncertain how a Lincoln cent obverse die was paired with a Roosevelt dime reverse, but this coin proves that it happened. No others are known to exist: it is believed that the present muling of a cent obverse with a dime reverse is unique. Cross-denomination errors are all but unheard-of from the U.S. mints. The only other examples that come to mind are the Sacagawea dollar/Washington quarter mules, of which about a dozen are known. Incredibly, this type of error occurred only recently, during the entire history of U.S. coinage that spans more than 200 years.

The obverse is sharply struck on the figure of Lincoln and the date, although the opposing dime die, being slightly smaller than the cent planchet, caused minor peripheral weakness on the obverse. In other words, nothing was behind the periphery of the cent die to force the expanding metal into the recesses. Naturally, the slightly smaller reverse dime die caused that side to be boldly struck. Shortly after this phenomenon dropped from the (mismatched) dies, it was discovered in a jewelry store in Michigan before entering circulation. It has since been carefully handled, and has developed no spots or other distractions. The coin remains a solid Premium Gem MS66, with full mint Red.

For the error specialist, this would be the centerpiece of an advanced collection. All error collectors will long remember the present coin and hope that someday it will again be publicly offered. This piece was widely publicized in *Coin World* and *Numismatic News* soon after its discovery. Since then, it has passed to two or three owners. This prize represents a unique opportunity. It is undoubtedly one of the most important highlights of this or any numismatic auction.

Is the Error Coin Market Taking a Breather?

As in all markets, whether Stocks or Real Estate, markets need to pause sometimes and take a breather. This is a good thing, as it allows necessary corrections and needed time to make any necessary adjustments.

Believe me, when I tell you things will not get any cheaper in the future, as more & more people are collecting errors. There is a severe draught of any new errors coming from the U.S. Mint. Any market professional will tell you supply & demand will fuel any market. So don't let it be said that we didn't advise you that this is a terrific time to buy errors.

Remember buy the very best you can afford, 1 quality coin is always better than 10 ugly coins.

NGC Discovers Proof Silver States Quarters Die Crack Errors

NGC recently identified die cracks on two issues of silver proof States Quarters. The first discovery was on a 2005-S Silver West Virginia Quarter, where a thin crack emerges from the rim at approximately 4:00 and enters the frosted devices. The second error, seen on a 2006-S Silver Colorado Quarter, is slightly more dramatic. It starts at the rim just past 1:00 and runs diagonally through the mirrored field, which makes it readily visible.

A submission consisting of a single 2006 Silver States Quarter Proof Set yielded the discovery of the Colorado Quarter. The West Virginia Quarter, however, was discovered in a submission of 100 Silver States Quarters Proof Sets from 2005, and 62 examples exhibited the error. NGC has graded over 180,000 Silver Proof States Quarters, and, with these pieces included, fewer than 100 such error coins have been identified. NGC graders were surprised to find this error in such quantity. The submitter of the 2005 Proof Sets, Boca Raton, Florida-based coin dealer *Finest Known*, was also not expecting this unusual trove of errors to be found.

When NGC first reported the discovery of a die crack on a proof 2004-S Wisconsin Silver Quarter in August 2005, we commented that several other proof States Quarters were known with die cracks, most notably the prominent ‘Spiked Head’ cracks which emerge from the rim at 6:00 on the obverse. These, however, are usually seen on clad (copper-nickel) coins. The appearance of a crack on a silver proof coin is much less frequent. All modern proof coins displaying die cracks are scarce as they are usually caught by the Mint’s quality control. As a result of their scarcity, they are all considered collectible.

A die crack occurs when a small break in the die allows metal to flow into the damaged area during striking. On the surface of the coin, this appears as a thin irregular raised line. If the broken die remains in production, more extreme errors can result, including a cud, an unstruck portion of a coin’s surface corresponding to an area on the die where a piece has broken away. Die cracks are relatively common on circulation issue coinage and small cracks can fall within accepted tolerances of flaws during coin production. Dies are replaced when a large crack appears. On proof coinage, however, coins with die cracks are deemed outside of acceptable tolerances and, when detected, are culled during quality control.

These coins are certified by NGC, and the position of the die crack is noted on the certification label. All were graded NGC PF69 ULTRA CAMEO.



1999 SBA Dollar Multi Struck Die Cap (Size of Morgan Dollar)

This is the largest SBA Dollar mint error that I've ever seen. It is a multi struck reverse die cap and is the size of a Morgan silver dollar. The "exit" strike was 80% off-center and is die struck both sides. This last strike ejected this die cap. Somehow this spectacular and dramatic mint error survived.



Kennedy Half Dollar Die Cap (Larger Than U.S. \$1 American Eagle)

This is the largest Kennedy Half Dollar mint error that I've ever seen. It is a multi struck reverse die cap and is larger than a U.S. \$1 American Eagle. Somehow this spectacular and dramatic mint error survived.



Unique SBA Dollar Mated Pair

This is one of two known mated pairs of SBA Dollars. This is a double struck SBA Dollar mated to an indented SBA Dollar. It is extremely rare and a very dramatic major mint error.





“Invisible Strike” in a West Virginia Quarter

In March of 2006, a very unusual West Virginia quarter was discovered by Gregory Capps, a member of my on-line group, the Error Coin Information Exchange (<http://groups.yahoo.com/group/errorcoininformationexchange/>). It shows a faint, curved groove on the obverse and the motto E PLURIBUS UNUM on the reverse. Both features lie directly opposite each other in vertical space. Above the motto you can just make out the top of the date (2005) and the exergue above that.

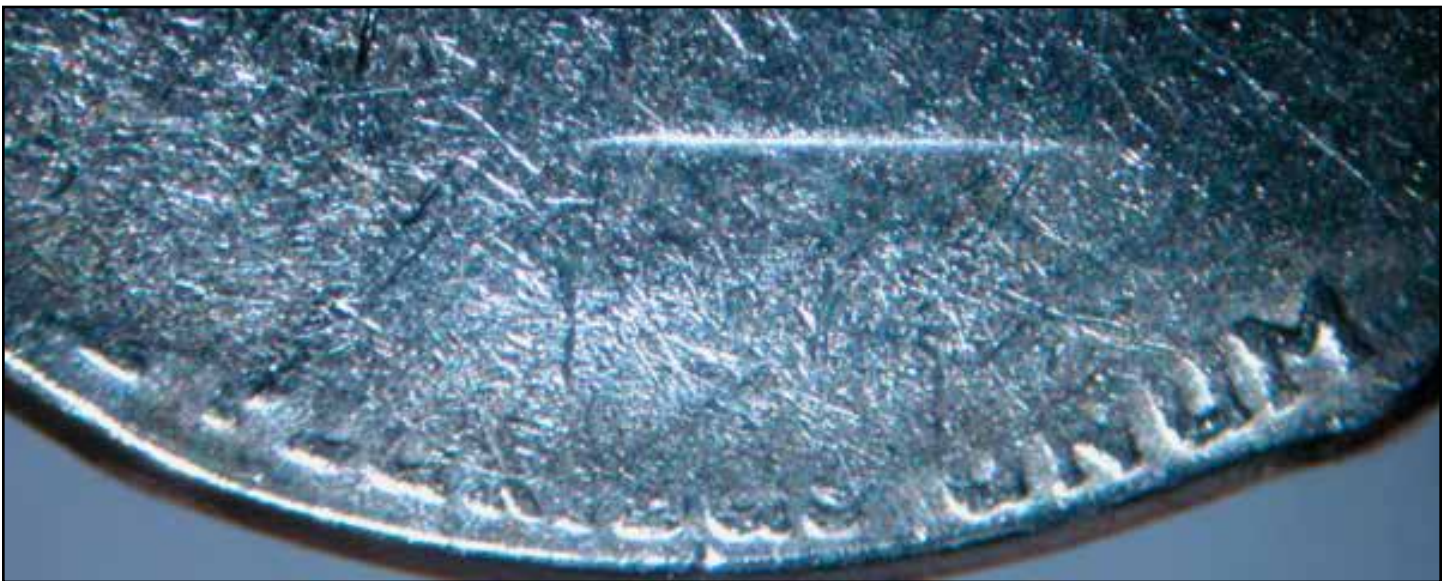
Faint die-struck design elements on the reverse include E PLURIBUS UNUM, the top of the date, and the exergue above the date.

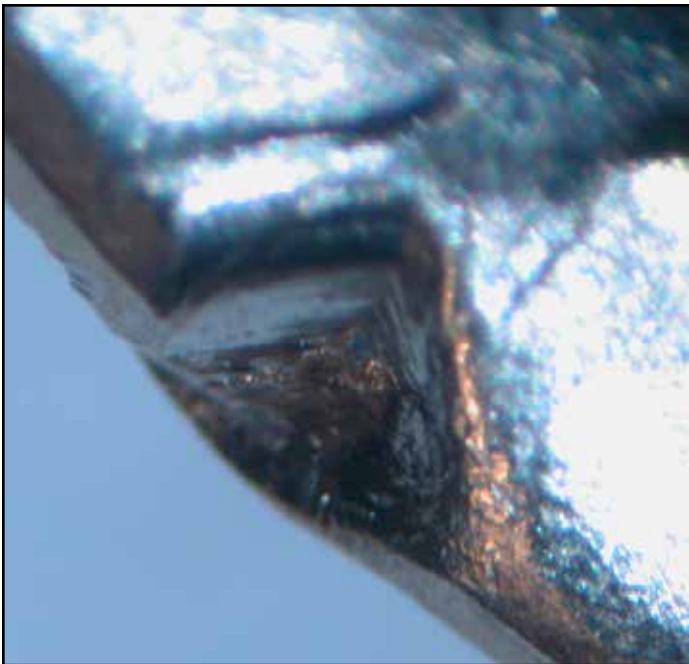
Close-up of the groove and the two angular indentations at each end.

The coin displays a very rare error type that I've designated an "invisible strike". An invisible strike occurs when the dies are out of adjustment, or are prevented from approximating normally, so at their closest approach they are farther apart than the thickness of a planchet. Normally in this situation the planchet is ejected from the striking chamber without showing any sign of having passed through it. However, if something intrudes into the striking chamber it will take up the excess space between the dies, permitting one of the dies to strike the opposite face (Diamond, 2000, 2003a, 2003b).

In this case, a machine part or a piece of hardware intruded into the striking chamber, leaving a thin curved arch on the obverse surface of the planchet. It does not appear to represent an impression of the proto-rim of an unstruck planchet. The arch is slightly lopsided and at each end there is a deep, angular indentation.



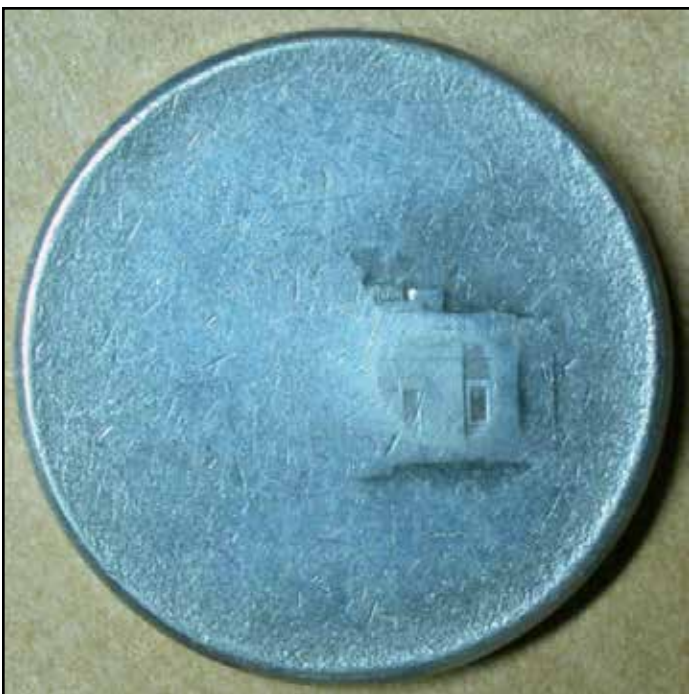
Close-up view of the left angular indentation.

It appears that the coin was struck out-of-collar as well. The deeper of the two angular indentations forced out a small bulge in the planchet's edge. I suspect that, if the collar had been deployed, I would have detected at least a trace of reeding at the apex of the bulge. But the edge is smooth throughout.

The West Virginia quarter is by no means unique. The images below show a very similar error on a nickel. The reverse shows an island of design (part of Monticello) while, directly across from it on the opposite face, there is a shallow, roughly circular depression. I'm not sure what caused this strike-through error, but this intrusive object took up the excess space between the dies, permitting a weak but recognizable strike to form on the opposite face.

Invisible strikes that occur in conjunction with strike-through errors are less frequently encountered than those that co-occur with indents and partial brockages. Figure 6 shows a more “conventional” invisible strike in a nickel. This nickel was struck about 30% off-center, but more than half of that strike is invisible. The reason we have any design at all is that a nickel planchet intruded between the obverse die and the planchet represented by this coin. The intrusive planchet took up the excess space between the dies, leaving an indent on the obverse and permitting a clear strike on the reverse directly across from the indent.

Invisible strikes are the ultimate quarry for the collector of weak strikes. Had it not been for a lucky accident, each one would have been indistinguishable from an unstruck planchet.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are double/multiple strikes?



When a blank planchet is struck by the dies, the normal procedure is for the feeders to eject the struck coin out of the collar and into a chute. If there is a malfunction and the struck coin isn't ejected, it may receive a second or third strike by the dies. A multiple struck coin can happen in many ways and have many combinations of errors.

Frequently Asked Questions

What are off-metal errors?



Wrong planchet and off-metal errors occur when a correctly made blank from one denomination is accidentally fed into a press for another denomination. Examples are a nickel struck on a cent planchet and a cent struck on a dime planchet. The coin struck on an incorrect blank will weigh exactly what the denomination of that blank would have been. An even more dramatic wrong planchet error is a coin struck on a previously struck coin of a different metal.
